- It affects 1 in 9 babies born in the United States.
- Can lead to long-term health problems and lifelong disabilities.
- It is the leading cause of death during the first month of life.
- Causes developmental delays, cerebral palsy, blindness and intellectual disabilities.
- Affects 11 percent of babies born that are covered by employer sponsored health plans.
- Places \$12 billion in excess health care costs on businesses annually.
- Absenteeism and lost productivity related expense is substantial.
- Employers pay 12 times more in healthcare costs, on average, for premature/low birth weight babies as the pay for babies born without complications.

The mission of the March of Dimes is to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects, premature birth and infant mortality. More about the March of Dimes:

The March of Dimes is one of the nation's oldest and most respected charitable organizations. It was founded by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1938 in attempt to conquer polio. He asked all Americans to send a dime to Washington to help find a cure for Polio, the response was overwhelming. The outcome was unprecedented; by 1955 the Salk vaccine "the cure" was found! Since that time the March of Dimes has been all about the health and wellbeing of babies. Examples of research funded by the March of Dimes includes the development and widespread use of the APGAR score for new born infants, Surfactant therapy which treats respiratory distress syndrome in severely premature infants (it is the reason that these tiny miracles do so well) and much, much more.

Where does the money for research and programing come from?

Over 95% of the money that funds the March of Dimes mission comes by way of charitable contributions. The largest fund raising event annually takes place each spring. March for Babies events will take place throughout the United States in April and May. These events provide the financial fuel to fund the many great educational programs and resources provided by the March of Dimes.

Here in Massachusetts we are in a very unique position, due to the number of research facilities that are a component of our medical community. For every fundraising dollar raised locally, four dollars comes back to our community in the form of grants and programing funded by the March of Dimes (that is some ROI).
